



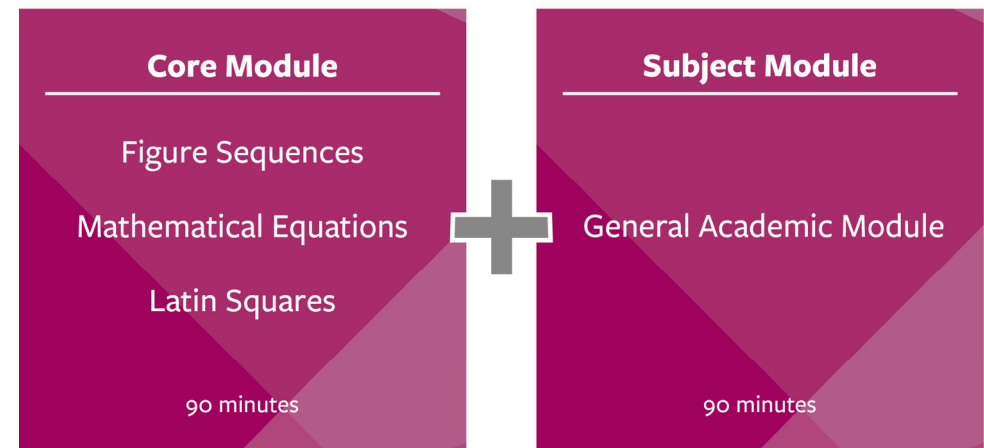
dMAT

Information for Exam Candidates
on 26 September 2026



Preparing for the Exam

- The dMAT is an **aptitude test for graduates**.
- The exam consists of a **Core Module** and a **Subject Module**.
- Each module takes **90 minutes**, with a **30-minute break** between the two modules.
- As part of the **APS procedure**, you will take the **General Academic Module** as your Subject Module.
- The dMAT assesses **skills and competencies rather than factual knowledge**.

Getting to your Examination Centre

- The exact addresses of the test centres and the times for identity checks and the start of the exam will be confirmed from 18 September 2026.
- Please check the participant portal for these details: www.d-mat.de/participants/login
- Plan your journey carefully and allow extra time for possible traffic or other delays.
- Participants who arrive late will not be admitted to the exam, even if they are only a few minutes late.

Entry and Identity Check

- Please bring the same **original official identification document** that you used to register for the exam (passport or Aadhaar card, for participants from Nepal, passport or NID card).
- Please have your **participant number and exam ID** ready. You may need them upon entry and will need them during the exam.
- Please also have your **login details for the participant portal** ready.
- If required, please bring any additional documents that your test centre has asked you to provide. Please check your emails regularly for updates.
- Please remain calm and be patient while queuing.
- Please follow the instructions given by the examination staff at all times.

Consent Form

- In order to be able to transfer your examination results to the Academic Evaluation Centre (APS) in New Delhi we require you to sign a *Declaration of Consent*.
- Please sign the form when asked to do so by the examination staff.
- Please ensure that you return the signed form to the examination staff.
- Without your consent, we cannot transfer your examination results to the APS.

Exam Rules

- Please observe the examination regulations at all times.
- The examination staff will explain the examination rules to you in full.
- The examination rules will also be displayed for you on the examination portal at the start of the exam.
- The following activities are prohibited, including but not limited to:
 - carrying any electronic devices, including mobile phones and smartwatches,
 - using notepaper,
 - taking notes or making recordings,
 - using rulers or calculators



Any breach of these rules will result in immediate exclusion from the exam.

During the Exam

- Eating is not permitted during the exam.
- Drinks may be brought into the examination room, provided they are in transparent, unlabeled bottles.
- You may use the restroom during the exam.
However, the exam will not be paused, so we recommend using the break for this purpose.
- Snacks may be eaten during the break.
- Some test centres may offer free refreshments.
- You are not permitted to leave the test centre during the break.



dMAT and the APS Procedure

- **APS India recommends registering on the APS portal and submitting the required APS documents as early as possible.** If your APS file is otherwise complete, APS India may be able to begin verifying your documents while you are waiting for your dMAT result. Once g.a.s.t. has released your dMAT certificate, you can submit it to APS India to complete your existing APS file. This may help avoid delays at a later stage of the APS procedure.
- **This option applies only to the dMAT certificate.** All other documents required under the applicable APS checklist must be submitted completely at the start of the APS procedure. Additional or updated academic records cannot be submitted later together with the dMAT certificate.
